Carefully Prepared Constitution Governing Activities of the Club-The State of

Officers

The constitution of the Olympian Athletic club, prepared by the general committee and approved by the membership, has just been released, with the slate of officers. The constitution reads:

Name of Club

"That the name of the club shall be the Olympian Athletic club. ets and Embl

"That uniforms, emblems and other

club insignias may be further designated by the initials E. K. — E. nated by the initials E. K.— E. standing for Elmwood, K. standing for Kildonan. Thus the name may appear E. K. Olympians.

Membership "Membership shall be confined to the residential community east of the Red river (excluding St. Boniface and Norwood), in Greater Winnipeg.

Oualifications "All young men in this community shall be entitled to join providing each shall satisfy the credentials

Policy

"All club activities such as may come under the general heading of policy shall be decided upon by the membership at large in their general meetings. That the responsibility for carrying out such policy shall rest

with the general committee. That each member agrees to co-operate with and assist to the best of his ability the general committee in ordering the affairs of his club. That C. S.

Disciplia "Each committeeman is charged with safeguarding the welfare of the club and enforcing its rules. The grounds committee will suspend any member breaking the rules indis-

member breaking the rules indis-criminately. Such a member may be taken back on probation by applying to the credentials committee, but if his offenses are continuously repeated he will be blacklisted and expelled permanently.

41. Inasmuch as it is the intention that the club shall become a community institution, drawing member-ship and support from all classes in

the community, members must not take any action on behalf of the club to support or favor, or discriminate against, any political organiza-tion or racial or religious body. "2. Members are not allowed to

use profane language, create a dis-turbance, or in any way conduct themselves in an objectionable man-

ner so as to reflect discredit on their club, either on the sports grounds, or in their relations as club memgrounds, bers with the public. "3. Members are expected to be courteous at all times to visitors and

visiting teams, and our own support-ers when they come to our grounds, club-rooms, or entertainments. "4. Members are required to respect and obey the decisions of such grounds, sports, and house committees, etc., as are delegated to regulate the activities of the club. Main Objects of Club

"To promote clean sport in the districts designated, and to provide a means and the opportunity for residents in the community to participate in some line of sport if they so desire: to community and the sport of so desire; to co-operate at all times with other sports organizations in the

district, and, whenever it is found to be mutually agreeable, to merge our activities so that advantages of centralization, better equipment, and so on may be secured and, thus, the sporting resources of the commun-ity fully developed. To give every

"That the executive functions be carried on by a body of officers, as follows: A president, a vice-president,
