



First Sod Turned For North Kildonan War Memorial

The memorial will honor citizens who fell during the First and Second World Wars, and will enable North Kildonan citizens to hold Remembrance Day ceremonies for the first time in their own municipality.

Earlier, they joined neighboring group in November 31 tributes.

The simple and impressive 10-foot tablet is of rose colored Manitoba granite, quarried in the Lac du Bonnet district.

It is located on a site south of the municipal office building, Henderson Highway at Essar. The North Kildonan War Memorial will be continuously lighted.

N.K. Drainage Under Study

It may be economically possible to drain 880 acres of North Kildonan land through a system being proposed by Transcona, via a storm sewer leading from a storage pond to the Red River Floodway.

Templeton Engineering Co., the municipality's consulting engineers, have been author-

ized by Council to make a cost estimate study as to what joint use North Kildonan could make with the proposed Transcona system, in order to drain the tract of land in the southeast corner of the municipality.

The company will report to Council as soon as costs are estimated.
